Fifty-three Rochester Ski Club members headed to Okemo, Vermont on January 9, 2022, for the club's first out of state ski trip in almost 2 years! As tradition, this was drive yourself, and like most years we had good snow, a day with sunny, blue skies, and for the most part nice skiing with almost no lift lines. For the second time we stayed at the Jackson Gore Inn which allowed **ski in and ski out** each day. Tuesday we woke up to below zero temps, but with the several lifts that have bubble covers, the chairlift rides up the mountain were bearable.

Members were offered many options for this trip: hotel rooms with queen beds or studios, 1, 2, or 3 days of lift tickets with different prices for those under 65 or 65 or older, and breakfast vouchers. This did complicate the coordinating of the trip and gave **Jan Rogers**, our trip leader, a number of challenges working with the Vail Corporation, who now manages Okemo Mountain. Except for not being able to get lift tickets until Monday morning, I think most members thought the trip ran pretty

HOW TO CELEBRATE VALENTINE'S DAY AT BRISTOL EVENT CENTER




