## A message from RSC SKITRIP CHAIR..... Mark Grey

The Ski Trip Committee (Mark Grey, Gary & Elise Kloesz, Bob & Annie Bacon, Ann Baylor, Jim Blum, Scott Anthony, Barb McCauley) has been hard at work putting together a great slate of trips for 2024. So far, Killington, Sunday River, Stratton, Mt. Tremblant and, finally, Big White (British Columbia) have all been firmed up. All of these trips are presented through RSC publications (newsletter, brochure, flyers) and the website, and are now available for registration. The Sunday River trip is sold out and a waiting list is currently being created.

Although trip leaders have done a solid job in putting together these trips, there are some **changes to the usual pricing and logistical procedures.** First, the process of purchasing/acquiring lift tickets: many resorts are requiring advance online purchase of lift tickets by skiers rather than through the trip leader. Where noted in the RSC Winter Trips 2024 brochure or on individual trip flyers, participants on some of our trips (e.g., Killington, Sunday River) will need to purchase tickets on their own with our club discount. Where needed, the flyers will specify the procedures to follow, and will indicate the applicability of passes, such as Ikon.

Second, all of our trips will **utilize RSC's new operating system using** *Wild Apricot*, to register or pay for a ski trip. However, the procedures of the past will still be available. Again, instructions for registering and paying will be included on the flyers for each trip. Should you have a friend or relative who would be pleased to join you on this year's ski trip adventure, please remember that RSC membership is a requirement for participation on all RSC ski trips. I hope you're looking forward to getting out on the slopes for these great trips as much as I am!

A site that makes life easier for members and event leaders is the result of a lot of hard work.

A s you know by now, the new RSC website, <u>rochesternyskiclub.com</u>, has been running since April,2023. All of our legacy documents and links from the old site have been retained and moved to their new home and after a three month overlap the old site has since been shut down.

RSC Membership Directory, club history, trips, social events, and other important documents are are now accessible. Photos from the old website have been archived. They will eventually be on the new site, however transferring these photos has become one of the most time consuming parts of the migration. Bev McElheny is working on this archive to re-develop how it will be organized and presented on the new site.

The major test, however, would depend on how well the "interactive" part of the new site would function: ie. to register/pay for RSC Spring Banquet, renew/pay RSC memberships, and register/pay for the RSC Summer Picnic. Many members have used it and found, for them, the site worked very well.

Early experience with the website function went fairly smoothly. Payments made on line were processed successfully and securely. Event leaders can now receive up to date and accurate periodic information on people and their payment. A site that, hopefully makes life easier for members and for those leading events, is the result of a lot of work.
